Day One - Arrive in Ōtepoti Dunedin

Day Two - Muaūpoko Otago Peninsula

Larnach Castle

Larnach Castle, New Zealand's only authentic Castle, was built in 1871 by businessman and politician William Larnach. Discover the castle's exciting, scandalous, and somewhat tragic history while exploring the magnificently carved interiors, the garden of international significance, a collection of New Zealand antiques and breath-taking views from the top of the turret.





Natures Wonders – Argo Wildlife Tour

Nature's Wonders offers picture perfect spectacular coastal views and amazing wildlife - penguins, seals and sea birds. The Otago Peninsula headland, Muaūpoko, is arguably the most precious wildlife habitat in New Zealand and the farm owned by the Reid family is on the forefront. A tour on the Argo, the 8x8 wheel off-road vehicle takes you up close to the magnificent wildlife in their natural habitat and to views that make you feel like you're at the end of the earth.

Royal Albatross Centre - Unique Tour

Nestled at the tip of the beautiful Otago
Peninsula Muaūpoko, is the world's only
mainland breeding colony of Northern Royal
Albatross. Witness the fascinating social life
of the breeding colony and have the chance
to be awed by the soaring three-metre
wingspan of the albatross flying above.
History is also a key focus of the Royal
Albatross Centre. Visit Fort Taiaroa which
features fully restored tunnel systems and
the Armstrong Disappearing Gun.

Monarch Wildlife Cruise

MV Monarch leaves from the wharf at Wellers Rock and offers bird and wildlife viewing on its one hour cruise around Taiaroa Head. The cruise travels out to sea, past dramatic volcanic cliffs, pristine sandy beaches, and a historic lighthouse. Along the way you'll see the huge royal albatross, their nesting sites, and a large fur seal colony. Their tours often spot other animals including rare seabirds and other albatross species, sealions, dolphins and blue penguins.

Blue Penguins Pukekura - 5:30pm

At dusk, watch from just a few metres away as the world's smallest penguins, kororā, emerge from the sea. The 90-minute tour includes a walk through the reserve to understand the penguin habitat and biology. Learn about Māori history and hear about intriguing stories that originated here. Then, as the sun sets, head to the observation deck to await the arrival of the little blue penguins. This is a not-to-be-missed wildlife tour with guaranteed sightings of penguins which makes for exceptional viewing.

Olveston Historic Home Tour

Olveston Historic Home is New Zealand's finest historic house. Built as the family home of philanthropist David Theomin, the house was gifted to the city complete with all the original contents in 1966. This architectural masterpiece is set within a garden of National Significance and Olveston is a visual, historic, and aesthetic delight with artworks, sculptures and tapestries telling the story of this wealthy merchant family.

City Sights Tour

A tour that is purely city sights including, Baldwin Street, the world's steepest street, and some other iconic Dunedin spots including Dunedin Railway Station, University of Otago and the heart of the city the Octagon.



Tühura Otago Museum

This is Dunedin's most visited attraction and includes options that will suit any age or nationality. Experience Tūhura, the fun interactive science centre with 45 exhibits including a three-storey slide, a forest filled with tropical butterflies, and an infinity room. The southernmost planetarium has daily presentations of the Otago night sky as well as a range of other shows on its full dome screen. The galleries contain nationally and internationally significant collections that tell the stories of Otago, New Zealand, and the world throughout time.

Lan Yuan Dunedin Chinese Garden

Lan Yuan Dunedin Chinese Garden is an authentic example of a late Ming early Ching Dynasty scholar's garden and celebrates the Chinese influence on Otago's history and heritage. It is one of only three outside of China, and the only garden in the southern hemisphere. Lan Yuan is a tranquil oasis in the city and visitors can enjoy traditional-style Chinese teas.

Orokonui Ecosanctuary


Orokonui Ecosanctuary is a large predator free cloud forest and home to some of the world's most fascinating and rare forest birds, reptiles, and plants. The walking tracks suit all abilities and make sure you visit the Eucalyptus forest to see the tallest tree in New Zealand. We recommend joining a tour to learn more from their expert guides, though you can explore on your own. The award-winning sustainably designed visitor centre is complete with informative displays, eco-friendly gift shop, Café and spectacular views across the sanctuary.

Karitāne Māori Tours

Karitāne Māori Tours is operated by Kāti Huirapa, one of the Māori marae in the wider Dunedin area. There are three tour options available: waka tours on the Waikouaiti River provide insight to the ecology and history of the area; guided walks on Huriawa Peninsula introduce the history of the indigenous people that have lived in the area for 800 years; cycle tours starting at the beautiful Puketeraki Marae pass through unique ecological zones and share traditional knowledge about flora and fauna. Visitors can book one or a combination of the offerings.
